

Potential Publication in International Journal of ePortfolio

All presenters are invited to write an article based on the research or practice they will present. We plan to publish these manuscripts in a special issue of The International Journal of ePortfolio (IJeP) in Spring 2015. Each manuscript will move through the regular IJeP peer review process prior to publication, providing authors with the possibility of a peer reviewed publication in addition to a conference presentation. Best of all, the broader e-portfolio community will gain valuable resources on the effects of e-portfolios on learning and pedagogy.

To be able to accomplish the ambitious goal of publication in the Special issue in Spring 2015, we will need your manuscript draft no later than December 1, 2014.
