Chapter 6: What Shall I Render to the Lord for All His Benefits Toward Me? Life Application Verses: Psalms 116.

Have you ever had a sleepless night? The sort of night in which something bothered you, like one of the children or grandchildren were ill, you had just lost a parent, your boss sends you an email and says that he or she needs to see you at the earliest convenience, yet not a word why the meeting was so urgent? Ever have one of those nights? You even think of the Words of Jesus in Matthew 6: 27: "Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?" In 6: 27-34, He is telling us not to worry because if we first seek the Kingdom of our God, all things we need will be added to us. But, we can't shut off that valve that leaks a bit of worry into our minds, like a dripping faucet. Drip, Drip, Drip, Worry, Worry. So, if it is impossible for us to eliminate ALL of our worry, maybe we can divert worry into the Promise of God above.

When you consult a thesaurus on the word, 'worries', you get a lengthy list: doubts, qualms, uncertainties, reservations, fears, suspicions, concerns, apprehensions, anxieties, cares, burdens, uneasiness, nervousness, frets, troubles, and there are more. But listen to what the writer of Psalms 116 says: "I love the Lord, because He hears my voice and my supplications." Another way to say this is that I love my God, because he hears my doubts, fears, anxieties, cares, burdens and my prayers, petitions, appeals, requests, pleas, and my heart. You are having a sleepless night because you are worried about something that keeps you up, or at the least, is causing you a restless night; but God hears your voice with all those worries when you open up your heart and make those worries known to Him in prayer. How can you not love your God that takes the time to hear your pleas for comfort? Worry is driven out when we give God our worries

because He hears our voice and brings Peace to our doubts, qualms, uncertainties, reservations, fears, and ... Give God your worries in Christ; let His Peace of mind, heart, and body bring comfort so that your sleepless night turns into Resting in the God that hears our voice.

When we have worries about something, it causes us to want to talk to someone about it. We want to share our thoughts, concerns, and get support from our friends or family to help with these uneasy thoughts. But, take a look at v. 2. "Because He has inclined His ear to me, Therefore I shall call upon Him as long as I live." Think about something for a moment: In v.1, we have the assurance that God hears our voice when we Pray, but in v.2, He is not just listening, He is intently listening. Why? Can you fathom the depth of how God listens to us, by the idea that "He has inclined His ear to me?" That's not casual listening, that's active-interested listening. Have you ever been in a situation where you could 'almost' hear something? What did you do to improve your hearing? You inclined your ear in the direction of the sound you were trying to hear because you desired to hear the sound or voice more clearly! Imagine God doing that for us!

God doesn't just listen, He inclines His ear to us to hear us clearly, fully, and with Love. If we are the Children of God, that should give us Hope and Joy, that our God—the God of all creation, the Father of Christ Jesus, the One True God—is not just a casual listener to our needs, but inclines His ear to hear to us in Love, Mercy, and Grace. Should we do any less than Honor and Glorify Him, as we "call upon Him as long as we live!" In our supplications before God, let us not forget to also give Him our Thanks for His Mighty Love in Christ Jesus. Remember the story Jesus told of the ten lepers, and only one returned to thank Him for His healing! Be that one before the Throne of God, where Christ is seated at the right-hand of the Father. Think on these things because if our God, who holds the very breath in our lungs will incline His ear to us to hear our worries, then how awesome is our God in Love, Mercy, and Help in times of trouble or need!

At the end of 2015 and into the first of 2016, I went through a bout with pneumonia. Many of you, also, have experienced illness in your life. When we experience these times of physical distress, we are what we read in v. 3 – 15. At one point in my fight for breath, I actually thought I might not make it through the illness. I couldn't function, missed several weeks of work, and I actually feared for my continuance because I wanted to be here for my family for a while longer (especially my 6 year and 9 month old grandchildren). The 'cords of death encompassed me...I found distress and sorrow." I did call on the Name of the Lord, I was brought low, and yes, I Prayed, "O Lord, I beseech you, save my life." It took some 6-to-8 weeks before I was 'normal.' I gave thanks also: "The Lord has dealt bountifully with me; He has rescued my soul from death, my eyes from tears, my feet from stumbling. I shall walk before the Lord in the land of the living."

Have you ever been in a situation like this? Maybe from illness, loss of a job, a child that was so sick your heart was broken just from the stress? Whatever you are going through, call on the name of the Lord: 'Then I called upon the name of the LORD: "O LORD, I beseech You, save my life!" Gracious is the LORD, and righteous; Yes, our God is compassionate. The LORD preserves the simple; I was brought low, and He saved me. Return to your rest, O my soul, For the LORD has dealt bountifully with you."' God, in Christ Jesus, answers our earnest Prayers. The answers are in His Will to provide as He deems it best for our lives. I don't have the Mind of God,

but I do know from personal experience, that God deals bountifully with us in many different ways. We must call on Him at all times for Help and to also Praise Him. Don't forget that: there are two sides to Prayer: 1) the petitions from our worries and concerns; and, 2) our thanks to God for answering our Prayers.

How do we thank God for inclining His ear to us?: "What shall I render to the LORD For all His benefits toward me? I shall lift up the cup of salvation and call upon the name of the LORD. I shall pay my vows to the LORD, Oh *may it be* in the presence of all His people." Ask yourself that question daily: What will I give my God for all He has done for me? For healing, for Eternal Life in Jesus, for giving us the Holy Spirit to comfort us in times of losing a loved family member; yes, we may grieve sorely at the loss of a member of our family, as my family grieved when my mother went Home singing Praise to the Lord of Lords and King of Kings! But we take heart also, because in these verses, God gives us a Mighty Powerful view of how He views the loss of <u>His and our</u> loved ones: "Precious in the sight of the LORD Is the death of His godly ones."

As part of your rendering to the Lord, start out each day by remembering Psalms 118: 24, and Lamentations 3: 23: (Paraphrased) "This is the day that the Lord has made, I will rejoice and be glad in it, because His mercies are new every morning." Then, render to the Lord Kindness, Love, Mercy, Help, Study, and what you know in your heart is 'right in the Sight of the Lord in Christ.' Since my pneumonia, I have given God in Christ ALL that I am. I desire to seek His Face in Love, Obedience, and Prayer. It's not perfect because I am not perfect; but neither do I intend to give up on my best effort of "what shall I render to the Lord for all His benefits toward me?" Remember, we must walk before the Lord in the land of the living—as Witnesses to His Glory in Christ Jesus, as those who turn not a blind eye to the needs of the less fortunate or the lost!

Make every day count for Jesus, or Carpe Diem for Christ! Seize the day for Jesus; render to God each day Honor and Glory that God in Christ deserves as daily service to His Majesty to answer: "What shall I render to the LORD For all His benefits toward me?" Live your life as if today is the day of service; tomorrow is another day of service; and my life is a life of service. What shall I render to God in Christ Jesus for the abundance of giving me life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness? The name of Jesus will never depart from my lips, nor my heart; nor from loving my family or the lost as He loves me! Glory to God in the Highest! 16 O LORD, surely I am Your servant, I am Your servant, the son of Your handmaid, You have loosed my bonds. 17 To You I shall offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving, And call upon the name of the LORD. 18 I shall pay my vows to the LORD, Oh *may it be* in the presence of all His people, 19 In the courts of the LORD'S house, In the midst of you, O Jerusalem. Praise the LORD!

As I am considering at this very moment what to write in this empty space, I am inclining my *own* ear to God's direction. What would He say to us if <u>He</u> were typing on this clicketyclackety keyboard? I think He has said to you and me that He cares about us all the time, not just when it is convenient, when we are ill, or when our loved ones are sick or have left us for their Heavenly Home! Sometimes we serve *Him* when it is convenient and maybe as we have read these verses and considered their application to us, that convenience in service to God is not the response that we need to render to our Lord. Rather, we need to be reminded that we must pay our vows to the Lord in every endeavor of our lives. Our vows should be driven by presenting Honor to our God in every facet of our life. From the time we get up (some of us at odd hours of the morning) to the time we simply can't go another step, our vows are to be Faith-based intentional. In his book, *Turn The Ship Around*, L. David Marquet¹ uses a phrase to speak of how leadership significantly changed the nuclear submarine he commanded. The phrase was, "Control without competence is chaos." I want to modify that phrase to give us something to seriously consider; "Faith without competence is chaos." Let me state it this way:

To be saved, we must accept Jesus Christ as the Son of God, and in Faith receive this gift. This gift of salvation is the 'given' baseline of all Christianity. But being saved cannot (should not) be followed-up by what I have heard many times: 'saved and sit-down Christians." That's the chaos. Our Faith in and acceptance of Christ was how we were saved; our study in God's 'Wonderful Words of Life' is how we gain competence in our Living Faith. I am here to proclaim that Christian competence is not optional, it is what God teaches us in the Old Testament lives of

Moses, Elijah, and all those we read about; Jesus taught us in the Gospels and Paul and others in the Books of the New Testament. In sum total, our competence to pray effectively, live Heavenly Minded, Earthly Good lives, witness through our discomfort when talking to strangers about Jesus, be the best employee that you are able to be, and call upon God with the confidence He desires, is based upon our study and application of God's Word. This means that we study His Holy Words, not read them... STUDY THEM! APPLY THEM! LIVE THEM! COMPETENCE IN THE WORD! We are to avoid, "Faith without competence is chaos."

Faith is stepping out to accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior. Faith lived is what happens after we accept Christ as our Lord and Savior, and that is where the rubber-meets-the-road. That is life lived every single day and living a Christian life must not be chaos; we can't live our Faith if we don't know what our God says about life's decisions or how we should respond to people around us or just the normal outcomes we produce throughout the day and night! A competent faith is based on God's direction in life and that comes through the study of His Word (and Bible Study groups, sermons, and so on). Simply put, what shall I render to the Lord for all His benefits toward me if my Faith is based on chaos because my understanding of God Himself or Jesus is based on incompetence in continuous knowledge of His word? How can you be a servant if you don't know the One you desire to serve? How can you know Him if you don't study His Technical Reference Guide? How will you know what to render if your Faith is bound in chaos?

Before I end this discussion, let me say one more thing: *I'm not going to leave any reader with the impression that if you believe in Christ Jesus as your Savior that you are an incompetent Christian.* Please understand that the more you study God's Word, pray, focus on His guidance in your life, the less *self-driven* chaos there will be. Before my Lord, I confess that I have lived through a time when 'Faith without competence was chaos.' I was a 'backslider', if you will accept that term, and even though I had made a profession of faith in Jesus, I was a selfcentered prodigal son for a time. It nearly cost me a career. I was living in chaos because I was 'incompetent' in and rebellious to the Word of God. I didn't read or study or even seriously consider it; my prayer life was nil (except when I was in trouble). My faith had saved me, but I lived in a distorted and self-serving world of my own chaos-making because I was "incompetent" in being faithful to study and prayer and living my Faith. Now, my prima facie question in life is:

'What shall I render to the Lord for all His benefits toward me?'

A Question of Curiosity:

In your daily life, do you study God's Word and pray? If not, what other areas of your life do you make time for? Which is more important: other things in life or to build up our Faith in God? Can you make time for the One who holds the very breath that we breathe? Make a list of those things you would render to God for all His benefits toward you? Can you see it? Do you see the balance scale with His Benefits on one side and 'your rendering' on the other? Which way is the scale leaning?


My Prayer For You
